2012/2013 federal tax credits



Signed into law in January 2013, the federal tax credit rewards homeowners who make high-efficiency improvements to their home, including replacement heating and cooling systems. The program allows homeowners to take up to a \$500 total credit on their taxes during 2012 and 2013. The credit is limited by 10 percent of installed costs.

HERE ARE THE DETAILS:

- Qualifying product must be placed in service between January 1, 2012, and December 31, 2013.
- Qualifying product must be for taxpayer's principal residence.
- \$500 is the maximum total amount that can be claimed for all products placed in service during 2012 and 2013.
- If a homeowner has taken more than \$500 in 25c tax credits since January 1, 2005, they are ineligible for any further credits.
- Qualifying product must have a Manufacturer Certification
 Statement, a signed statement from the manufacturer certifying
 that the product or component qualifies for the tax credit.

 Taxpayers must keep a copy of the certification statement for
 their records, but do not have to submit a copy with their
 tax return.

• Homeowners should save their receipts.

FEDERAL TAX CREDIT HEATING AND COOLING QUALIFICATIONS.

Below are the minimum requirements for heating and cooling system qualification:

Heating & Cooling Product	Minimum Performance Requirement	Limit (up to 10% of installed costs)
Split-system air conditioners	16 SEER and 13 EER	\$300
Split-system air-source heat pumps	15 SEER, 12.5 EER and 8.5 HSPF	\$300
Packaged air conditioners	14 SEER and 12 EER	\$300
Packaged heat pumps	14 SEER, 12 EER and 8.0 HSPF	\$300
Gas furnaces	95% AFUE	\$150
Gas furnaces	Advanced main air circulating fan	\$50
